"Good Liguar Gonna Carry Me Down"- for heaven's sake there's no development like that in Paul Geremias carreer to be noticed.


Glide Guitar Riffs, that's it! "One More Last Time" especially shows that! Slowly but surely I am through with my repertory of compliments.

At the last minute I managed to get tickets for the premiere on 6th of Feb.,1996 at the Etablissement Ronacher.

-What event?

In America, and meanwhile in Europe as well, Queen Esther Marrow is known as

"The First Lady Of Gospel Music".

When she was only a child, her grand-mother already med to take her to the Gospel mass. It was only a small step to the church choir, where

"Queen Esther Marrow was discovered by Duke Ellington"

she already attracted attention because of her expressive voice.

Her career as a solist was a logical consequence, and finally she founded her own formation.

After that, she became quite famous in a very short time, and Duke Ellington discovered her and engaged her as a singer for his spiritual Jazz- concert "Come Sunday".

Things went on: appearances together with Bob Dylan, B.B. King, Chick Korea, Ella Fitzgerald, Harry Belafonte and Lena Horne. But the top- event (it is her personal favorit, too) was the appearance together with Mahalia Jackson.

She took over the main- part in George Faison's Broadway play "Sing, Mahalia, sing" and toured throught about all the cities of America.

In 1990 she wrote and produced her own Musical "Truby Blessed", which is a story about the life of the Gospel



Lowell Fulson was born in March 1991 in Tulsa, Oklahoma. He grew up in

LOWELL FULSON

a small town near the Mexican border, which was called Atoka.

He didn't at all grow up with the Blues. He rather played "White-music" with a String Band. You could hear that in all those years by listening to him playing the guitar.

He had three idols. Blind Lemon Jefferson, Lonnie Johnson and the piano player Big Mace. His being popular started in school, already, when he won a prize for presenting poems.

"But in Oklahoma I could had a doctor degree and still would have remained dishwasher".

And that's the job he actually got. The only difference was, that he besides earned a little money by singing and playing the guitar at smudgy bars. That was quite easy in those days.

After a perioud of time he got the opportunity to play together with the singer Texas Alexander. As Alexander didn't play any instruments, he needed somebody to accompany him when he was going on tour.

While to the 2nd worldwar, Lowell served in the Army and there had the possibility to stay together with some other musicians and to exchange experience. In the end of the Fortis, the californian recordindustries, which had suffered a lot from the restrictions of the War, slowly recovered.

Some day Lowell met **Bob Geddins**, who was working at a one hand record- press in a record shop. Lowell sat down beside him and started to play the guitar.

Bob, who concentratedly listened to his play, suggested to record Lowell Fulsons music. That was the beginning of Lowells studio-

career.He remained at the studio from 1946 to 1948. During those years he played about 70 titles, which were published by several lebels.A lot of the songs he played together with his brother.

"Three o' Clock Blues" is a song, which was then recorded by the Fulson- Brothers. This special song was a big breakthrough. But not for Lowell Fulson, but for **B.B. King.**

In the end of the Forties, Fulson only recorded for Swing Time, which was a remarkably bigger lable than Geddins enterprises were. That bro-



ught the chance for Lowell to play with a session- band. Its members were: Earl Brown (alto- sax), Lloyd Glenn (piano), Billy Hadnott (bass), and Bob Harvey (drums).

"Everyday I Have The Blues", a hit by Memphis Slim, was Lowells first Billboard- Charts- Hit in the early Fifties. You can call Lowell Fulson the **Muddy Waters** of the West Coast. Their structures of their careers are quite similar.

There was only one big difference: While Muddy Waters consequently followed his own musical style, Lowell did not. He was flexible and very creative. In 1954 Fulson signed a treaty at chess. The West Coast Blues was-n't very popular those

days, and a number of labels went bankrupt. The centers of Blues activities were New Orleans, New York, Chicago and Memphis.

The Chess- Brothers from Chicago know, that they could make money with Lowell, as they had sold his Swing- Time Songs in earlier times.

His first Hit at Chess was the song "Reconsider Baby", which newadays certainly belongs to the Blues-Standards. At that time, the song reached number 3 of the R&B Charts.

Fulson again started to change his style. His voice became darker and more powerful and his rhythm changed fro soft and subdued to full power and became more rocky.

That was exactly the trend of the Fifties

Two more times Fulson changed the label (Kent and Jewel), until it got quite around him in the Seventies. Although he took part at two big Blues- festivals, his activities were reduced to a minimum.

Until he had a vivid Comeback in 1978 with the song

"Lovemaker".

Fulson also left his marks on Europe. In 1984 he was on tour in Europe, accompainied by Dennis Walker (Songwriter and coproducer of Robert Grays earlier Hits) and the guitarist Phillip Walker. A lot of musicians still love his songs, as Lowell Fulson, really is unique regarding that wide range of musicals styles of Blues.

In the early Nineties Fulson puplished the album:

"Hold On"

Fulson does not let up. But not because of fearing a fall, obriously he is holding on to it with an aim.

We actually visited two of those theatres. And we enjoyed a perfect service at **Boxcar Willie's**. A quite refine motel, and besides there were lots of restaurants close to it. In the evening we went to **Boxcar Willie's theatre**.

It was completely sold out. And they offered a perfectly organiced show. No comparsion to the Austrian way. What they offer here is arranged up to the smallest detail.



Biography of Dale Watson

Thought Watson managed to get a treaty for two singles plus video at CURB Records, California, they were no more than a succès d'estime.

Only one week after Watson made a verbal agreement with the Californian manager Mitch Cohen from Santa Monica, he had a bad traffic-accident and his hand was injured that badly, that he had to honestly fear for his carreer as a guitarist.

"I thaught that I would have to stick to writing, and no more playing any longer",

Dale told us.

Fortunatly, those fears didn't became real. Cohen said, that it were no more than a small kickback and he instantly sent Dale to a wellknown doctor, who is specialize in hand-surgery. He actually succeeded in treating the hand, so that after a short while Dale could again play the guitar without difficulties.

Cohen payed for the doctor and said: "You will pay it back some day".

Dale almost couldn't believe all that. He felt very much like owing Cohen a debt of gratitude.

"He absolutly must be godsent", Watson says tdoay. "Up to now we still don't have a written treaty, and I had to kind of force him to accept a recording (one song) of my publications. I told him 'If you don't accept, I won't find peace, even if it will probably be only pennies and dimes, that come from BMI."

Later Watson went to Nashville where he introduced his demo-tape to several Major Labels.

The judgement by a boss at Arista Records, who had listened to Dale's songs, was symptomatical for the whole business: "Well, that would have been a Hit 25 years ago- and that woould have been a Hit 30 years ago...."

Dale Watson's Music was considered 'too Country'.- And that was it for the Nashville Labels! Dale worked for a while as a songwriter for **Gary Morris' Publishing Company**, but he couldn't stand this 9-to-5-job, where a such creative activity like writing songs was made a work on a production-line.

Dale returned to L.A., and a few months later he decided to move to Austin, Texas.

There at last things started to change, when a lot of different people started to pay attention to Dale Watson's music. Among them was a British Label, that was

very impressed by his demo-tape, and so Dale sent his tapes to High Tone Records, too.


"I didn't really believe that they would be interested, but their first reaction was, that they said, they wanted to get anything that had been recorded. Of course that was allright with me."

The treaty was signed rather quickly and Dale recorded his debutalbum "Ceatin' Heart Attack" (High Tone/1995) at the "Congress House Studio" in Austin, Texas.

"My boys and I played in the Studio", Dale said;

"That was one of the provision clauses, but they (High Tone) didn't have any problems with that". His boys are: Dave Biller(electric lead and rhythm guitar and acoustic guitar), GraigPettigrew (string bass) and Merel Bregante (drums), of Watsons band "Lone Star".

For the Studio sessions they engaged some additional highly qualified musicians; among them **Floyd**



Domino (Asleep At The Wheel) at the piano, Gene Elders (George Strait), at the Fiddle and Scott Walls, Jimmy Day and Marty Rifkin, three excellent steel-guitarists.

13 of the 14 (!) songs where written by Dale, just three out of them were only co-written by him! The first Single was the song "South Of Round Rock, Texas", which was written by Dale Watson & Dave Biller and has a video, too. This racy, Western - Swing - like song is to be found also on the August'95 sampler of the magazine "New Country", which is sold worldwide by abonnement.

Dale Watson has found his musical home in Austin, cause: "The real music is alive in this place", he says. "Lefty and Hank Sr. and Bob Wills, Buck Owens and Conway Twitty. Here people still appreciate that sound, and that's a sake for me, as I would like to barry that torch on to a new generation."

Good luck to you, Dale!

Vince Gill

Success was on Vince Gill's side. As the reigning CMA entertainer of the year, Vince stands in the first row of America's music industry and he surely is one of the best-loved artists nowadays.

He has got unbeaten 14 CMA Awards up to now, two years of "Entertainer Of The Year" and "Male Vocalist Of The Year" (for two years in a row).

Furthermore, Vince recieved six Grammy Awards, three ACM Awards and seven Music City News

Awards. Even as a songwriter, he won a lot of Award-Titles.

Such a huge lot of praise to his abilities could easily have gone to his head. But it didn't. More likely, it has taken place in his heart.

Gill's 'heartbreaker songs' haven't got anything to do with his real live. He has been married with his wife for 14 happy years, now.

An equally important factor of Gill's life is friendship. He has got a lot of friends in the music-branche. His very quiet nature and the total

lack of airs and graces are a consequence of his very long and difficult way to success. That's why all the fame didn't go to his head.

"Everything changed", he said about his success. "Except for my perseption, what I do and what I feel. Those things that I add to the work of other musicians are just as important as the things they add to a recording. If I hear my voice in a song on the radio, like for example at Patty (Loveless), "I'm as happy about it, as if I hear a song by my self on the radio".

Gill grew up in Oklahoma as

Bluegrass musician and son of a banjo player. At Highschool already Vince had a name as a musician. He went to L.A. for two years in order to work together with **Byron Berlin** (a Bluegrass fiddle player) and the band "Sundance".

In 1983 Vince contacted Rodney Crowel's band "The Cherry Bombs", signed a treaty with RCA and worked together with Tony Brown, the pianistof the Cherry Bombs.

Vince Gill left for Nashville, but



before he and Brown could record a common album, Brown changed to MCA. The chances for a career as a session-musician and singer were good for Vince Gill.

But he concentrated on songwriting and a solo-career. When Vince changed to MCA Records in 1989, he could again play together with Tony Brown, who predicted Vince a solo-career.

With his first song "When I Call Your Name" he had his breakthrought ever night. In this song he showed the whole range og his abilities, from Dance Hall Swing and Rodeo songs to nowadays Pop Music.

The Multi Platinum success of the album helped also his other Hits to the top.

It is Vince's love for Music and his love for performance, that he raised to the world's best. He left his marks on Europe, Asia and Australia.

"I believe, that there is a higher potential of audiants in Europe than there is in the States". And he continued: "One only had to open their ears to our sort of Music, let them have a little try onid and hope that they'll like our Music. Music is a way without political or language-borders."

"When Love Finds You" is a musical portrait that shows all the beautiful and also the dark sides of love.

The way Vince Gill lives his life, shows how long love can last-until long after the last sound faded.

Brett James

prett James was born in DOklahoma. For some years he lived in Oklahoma City. Then he and his parents moved to a small town about two hours from Oklahoma City to the West, which was named Cordell.

It is difficult for the artist to find that certain essencefor the mixture of hard-rocking, good-time and traditional Country Music.

But as he wrote each of these songs by himself, it can be seen as a signfor the rapide upriseof a new talent.

Brett interprets his music as part of his Western-roots.

"That's why singing and songwriting are so inseparable for me. A lot of the sound is just me - it's just what I know, what I'm about. Of course, you can only live so many songs, but if you're around real people and you keep your eyes and ears open, you get to see life from a different perspectives. To write and sing from each of those points of view is real satisfying".

A very strong motivation was his family. Most parents would simply go crazy, if their son comes, having just quit his medical studies in order to become a musician. His parents didn't.

He recalls his parents: "practically shoving me out the door toward Nashville when I told them".

Brett's mother is a classic pianist, his father is a doctor and, if you want to believe Brett, his father has the best voice of the whole family. During his childhood he sang at the church choir, later he played in a Teenie-Band. In those days he learned to play several Music instruments: guitar, piano, saxophone and


One special night his desire for professionality was satisfied in the Oklahoma City club, as he recalls:

"I had gone to a concert and was watching the guys up on stage and something

just clicked. It looked like

career: I'm having the time of my life. But if things hadn't worked out, well, hey, at least I'd never had to wonder what if".

Brett's creative talent and his fee-



they were having a lot more fun than I was. I went home that very night and started getting serious about writing songs."

His Debut-single "Female Bounding" is a light-hearted story about the thoughts of a young man. Brett wrote this song, when he was still in Oklahoma.

"Some songs come from right there inside", laughs Brett. "I didn't have to rely on imaginations for that one. You hang around with your buddies all the time, and that's great, but eventually you start thinking, 'Hey, enough's enough! Where are all the girls?"

"Worth The Fall" is another song from the Debut album, that comes from a very personal place.

"That song probably is the one I feel most deeply about, the one that's closest to my heart. I still learn from it, still have to thing about things every time I hear it.

I think that's a good thing to remember, that the ride is worth the fall. I can easily relate it to my ling for the detail bring power into his songs about the tough side of life:

"Wake Up And Smell The Whiskey".

Brett wrote the song together with Dean Miller (the son of Roger Miller). This song swings hard in the best Texas Honky-Tonk tradition.

"Some songs are fiction", says Brett,"and some are part of your own life story. All of these are real special to me, and hopefully that shows up when I sing them. I'm very fortunate to get to record all my own songs, especially on the first record. It just means more. If you've sweated over something until 2:00 in the morning, you're just naturally going to sing it from a different place. I plan to be singing and writing for a long, long time, and if that's going to happen, it's got to come from the heart."



E.E.: Do you (musically) surf on Garth Brook's wave?

Mrs.Yerawood: We'll see. I've realised a great love for Country music here, that I can feel. Whoever brings that music, I'm happy about it. E.E.: What do you think about the selling of your new album?

Mrs.Yerawood: I know, that only in Germany we already sold twice as many of the new albums than we did at the past album. That's a good sign. That's why I'm sure, that I will come here again.

E.E.: What kind of music do you make? Is that New American Music?

Mrs. Yerawood: It's Trisha music. It is very difficult for me to assoziate all those different names. But I think, it's a try to convince all those, who still do believe, that Country music is a bad word. It's like giving Country music a chance at those people, who have preconceived ideas about it. I believe that music is music. If you like it, you like it, and you won't judge it by it's name.

G.D.: Will you also go on stage with the Mavericks some day?

Mrs. Yerawood: I hope so. But Robert (husband and bassist at the Mavericks) and I don't want to make professional decicious on the base of personal affairs.

G.D.: As far as I know, you haven't written any of the songs by yourself up to now. How many songs do you listen to in order to arrange a CD? Mrs. Yerawood: I already wrote songs, that were recorded by Joy Lynn White and Kenny Rogers. But as I'm on tour most of the time, there's hardly enough time to write. But my producer and I have to listen to hundreds of songs. It's not exactly easy to find songs you can indentify with. That is very important, because people

have to feel, that you are behind it.

E.E.: Can you tell us the meaning of the "XXX's and OOO's" in your song?


Mrs.Yerawood: That's just a short form for "Hugs and Kisses", a proverb, which often used in the end of a letter. I don't know, if many people do that. To be honest, I just started doing it, when the song had became number 1.

G.D.: And what do you do, when you're not on tour?

Mrs.Yerawood: When I'm at home, I go to the collegs in order to talk to young people, who are interested in getting into the music or entertainment business. I try to have a positive influence on them and to answer to their questions in an honest way. I, too, learned a lot like that.

E.E.: Regarding Country music history, who is your greatest idol? Patsy Cline?

Mrs. Yerawood: As far as a beautiful voice is concerned, the most beautiful one I can ever imagine, I do admire Patsy Cline. Furthermore I admire the career of Emmylou Harris. Not only because it is very stabil, but also because of it's stainlessness. She always kept being true to her style.

Marty Stuart

E.E.: Where is your hat? (Allusion to his "No Hats" tour together with **Travis Tritt**)

Mr. Stuart: Where my hat is? Well, they confiscated it at the border.

Pr.: What do you think about the album "Rhythm Country And Blues"?

Mr. Stuart: I believe it is the project of the highest quality that Nashville has created for a long time. I sing a song named "The Weight" together with the Staple Singers. I learned the song from Levon Helm and the band. He is one of my favorite Mississippi-Delta-Blues-guitarists.

E.E.: You travel quite a lot of miles every year. No matter where the tour leads you to. What can you do about all those different kinds of weather in order to always keep your voice in a good state of health?

Mr. Stuart: The main thing is, drink a lot of water, few woman and no drugs.

G.D.: How did you find your very special sound? Mr. Stuart: I learned from the steel-guitarist Ralph Mooney, who had played for Buck Owens and Merle Haggard, and from Clarence White, who belonged to the Byrds and from Luther Perkins. The three of them mainly have influenced me since my childhood.

E.E.: Do you use specially produced guitars? (Marty possesses a huge collection of music instruments, especially guitars)

Mr. Stuart: The telecaster, that I play on stage, belonged to Clarence White. It has a very special mechanism, which makes it sound like a steel guitar. Real great sounds, you know like oink, oink...

E.E.: When will you go on a "No Hats Tour" with Travis Tritt for the next time?

Mr. Stuart: I'm sure we'd have lots of fun here. But we recorded some CD's together (e.g.: This One's Gonna Hurt You).

G.D.: Are you member of the Gran Ole Opry? Mr. Stuart: Yes, since November 1992.

G.D.:That must be a very special feeling.

Mr. Stuart: The Gran Ole Opry is a very special institution of concerning Country Music. It is called the motherchurch of Country Music. Of course it's something special to be part of it.

G.D.: When we want to talk about tradition: you started with Bluegrass Music at the age of 12, together with Lester Flatt. Wouldn't you want to again produce real Bluegrass Music todays?

Mr. Stuart: I'd love to do that; as when I was already 19 years old, Lester Flatt died. But unfortunatly it had always been and it still is very hard to live on Bluegrass music.

E.E.: Who wrote the song "Shake That Thing"?

Mr. Stuart: I wrote it, when I was looking for a song to open my concerts with.

E.E.: Have you got any hobbies?


Mr. Stuart: I love taking photos. At the moment I write a book about people in the Country music scene, guitarists, songwriters, stars, busdrivers, about all those, who get in touch with Country music in what ever way. I've been working on it for 15 years, and now I try to finish.


E.E.: I hope it will be available in Europe, too.

Marty Robbins

Marty Robbins

was born on the 26th of September, 1925, in Glendale, Arizona. As a child already, Marty was a fan of films that contained "singing cowboys". He was discovered by Little Jimmy Dickensat the TV-Station KPHO-TV in Phoenix.

After a short time he signed a treaty at Columbia, and from this moment his vertical take-off started. He was conmsidered a stylist of Western Music. "Gunfighter" and cowboy ballades with a mexican touchbehanged to his special style. He very much enjoyed writing those special Western songs and presented them with great power of persuasion.

His Top Hit of those days "El Paso". That song was added to an album, that shows the whole range of his mostly selfwritten Western songs, together with a book containing a lot of his lyrics.

Just sit down, relax and listen to it: Marty Robbins transports a feeling of freedom in his very special way and brings the virgin West of America directly into your livingroom.

Marty Robbins deserves a very especially nickname: The Man With The Teardrop In His Voice". That is a consequence of his Country as well as his Western ballades.

1953 to 1955 were the most successful years of Marty Robbins career. At that time he became a Star practically over

night. the 8th On December 1982 a great pioneer of Country and Western Music passed away....

New American Music

The line-up of the stars that will perform will send your temperature high. Why?

True American Country Music from America is step'n into Germany again.

I'll start with a list of my personal favorites, even thought I have to admit, that even this choice wasn't at all easy for me.

Travis Tritt, a very talented songwriter and Top-singer. After more than 10 years of hard work, he finally had his break-

through practically over night 5 years ago.

He started to sing together with his mother in the church choir, when he was only 4 (!) years old. Then, nobody could imagine, that he would discover a special love for five albums by Johnny Cash, Roger Miller, George Jones, Buck Owens, and Merle Haggard, and that those albums would inspire him that much, that he would start to teach him-

self to play the guitar at age of 8. When he was 14, he wrote his first songs, and he was kind of an outsider at Highschool, as he spent all afternoons at home practising his guitarplay like a maniac.

In 1984, after a quite unsatisfactory job, Travis started to play at any Club he got the possibility to.

In those days, **Danny Davenport** from Warner Brothers Records became attentive to the songwriter Travis Tritt. After having seen Travis Tritt live on stage, Danny Davenport instantly realised the enormous musical potential of that young artist and recorded some tapes with Travis at his home.

In 1989 his first Hit-Single "Country Club" was published by Warner Bros., and it meanwhile reached platinum!

Since then, he had one success after the other, and in 1992 Travis Tritt was accept as the 70th member of the Gran Ole Opry!

In 1992, Travis Tritt went on a "No Hats Tour" together with Marty Stuart, which was a full success. Both of them were nominated for the CMA Award "Vocal Event Of The Year" in 1992, and that's how things remained for Travis Tritt up to now.

Confederate Railroad is a Country music band, which was originally founded in a record studio. In 1991, the singer and songwriter **Danny Shirley** singned a treaty at Atlantic Records as a solo-artist.

Rick Blackburn of Atlantic Records, who noticed the talent of the five other musicians, Wayne Secrest, Michael Lamb, Chris McDaniel, Gates Nichols and Mark Du Fresne, wanted to take them as a band of six members, and the Danny Shirley Band became Confederate Railroad.

That mane comes from a locomotive, which was on the rail between



Chattanooga, TN and Georgia during the Civil War.

The six band members also came from Georgia. In 1985, '87 and '88 they published three albums at Amor Records. But those records didn't bring the longed for break through.

The Nashville of the 80'ies was still on the rail of traditional Country Music and didn't show a lot of interest for new styles. Still, they allready reached some placements in the Country Charts with some songs.

From 1987 to 1991 Confederate Railroad were on tour with **David Allen Coe**. In 1993 Confederate Railroad recieved the CMA Award "New Group Of The Year".

That was their real breakthrough. But strange enough, there are no songs on the albums, that were written by Danny Shirley. His self-criticism is to stern. Maybe he should let his fans decide?

Highway 101

In the end of 1986 four young unknown musicians found the band Highway 101. They got to know each other in a

studio in L.A.

Each of the musicians brought impressing abilities for the band.

In 1987 their debut-album with "The Bed You Made For Me" reached the Country Charts and became no less than number 4.

In 1988 they were nominated for the "Academy Of Country Music's Top Vocal Group Of The Year". With about any song or album, placements in the Charts followed.

In 1989 they recieved the CMA Award "Group Of The Year", and withhin the same and the following year, they got two Grammy Awards.

Here is a short introduction of these really excellent musicians:

Singer and lead-guitarist **Jack Daniels** has been a wanted musician since he was 17 years old.

Cactus Moser is singer and drummer at Highway 101.

Curtis Stone has joined his famous father and friends in singing and making music at home since childhood. His memories of those days are common hours together with Tennessee Ernie Ford and Dorsey Burnett. And he has a name as a songwriter, too. You can find his work on albums by Crystal Gayle, Juice Newton and many other artists.

Nikki Nelson has an expressive Country voice that offers Highway 101 the chance to produce a racy sound without sounding rocky.

It's the perfect time for a change. Highway 101 did it with the new album "Bing Bang Boom". That's something new, but it will for sure satisfy the fans of Highway 101.

Country Music Stars in Austria

In Austria quality is of increasing importance as far as the selection of musicians and bands for any kinds of Country Music events is concerned.

This time again the Country Circle Austria spent a lot of effort on presenting a pretentious program.

The main-act is for sure the presence of Chris LeDoux.

Chris was born on Oct., 2nd, 1943, in Biloxi, Mississippi. In young years already, all his love belonged to the horses and to Country and Western

When he was 15 years old, he got his first guitar and started immediatly to write his own songs, that tell about his life.

After Highschool he earned a living as a Rodeo Cowboy. But he always carred his guitar with him. He sang his own songs and played the guitar as a kind of hobby those days. As a recreation besides the mostly though job at the Rodeo.

In the early seventies Chris left the Roedo-Circus and went to Sheridan, Wyoming, together with two of his friends, in oder to record some tapes at a friends studio.

At that time his parents took action and they founded an Independant Label "American Cowboy Songs". They introduced him to several magazines.

But ever and ever again, Chris was magnetically torn back to the Rodeo. His goal was to win the Golden Buckle. And he achieved that in 1976!

Meanwhile, 5 albums occured at his small Label and were promoted and sold only in the Rodeo scene.


Chris became wellknown no earlier than when Garth Brooks told in a song on his debut-album, about the live of a Rodeo-Cowboy, where one of the lines in the song says something about a "worn-out Tape of Chris LeDoux".

Suddenly there was a lot of public interest. The Radio stations were eager to get Chris' albums. Liberty Records, too, didn't want to miss the chance and they entered an agreement with Chris.

A duett together with Garth Brooks

"Whatcha Gonna Do With A Cowboy" brought them place 5 of the Billboard-Country-Charts. So join me in looking forward to Chris LeDoux!

Mel Mc Daniel is also a candidate for a fast take off in the Charts. His home in Louisiana also gave him the idea for his Hit song "Louisiana Saturday Night". Today, about every



band surely can play that song, and still people have listening to it.

Today Mel Mc Daniel lives in Nashville and devates himself to Down-To-Earth Country Music.

Lynn Morris counts to the female Top of Bluegrass Music. But she isn't only top in means of young Bluegrass Music, she is also able to interprete Folk and Country Music in an excellent way.

Candee Land can be seen as a Newcomer singer from Texas with international ambitions. That way she recieved a price for the best selling album of 1993 Netherlands. Furthermore, her abilities in more traditional domains, like "Jodeling Songs" for sure are, like for example "Lovestick Blue", are really impressing.

Chuck Drum is also from Texas, and his musical style is (my personal hobby) Honky Tonk Songs and New American Music.

He presents his songs in a very professional way, although he is only 28 years old. Some call him the Texanian answer to Garth Brooks. Let's have a try on his ability oursel-

Santiago Jimenez, who we could already admire last year, this time comes here with a female singer and a new band. The accordeon is his speciality, he can play it like no one else can.

With that instrument, which is typical for TEX-MEX music, he managed to reach the top of the worlds best musicians. He comes from a family of musicians who established themselves in the same musical style.

Autumn Leaves come from Germany and they are quite wellknown there. They won lots of music-prizes, and now they want to present themselves to the Austrian audience.

Dobro, we know that as a musical instrument. As a fact, we're talking about an Italien band this time, who plays quite modern Country Music, but with traditional Bluegrass instruments, like for example the banjo, the fiddle or the mandoline.

It's not necessary to intrduce the Nuggets once more, I guess. They have been wellknown in Austria for a while, now, as they can be called Austrians oldest Bluegrass and Oldtime Music band. In 1995 they won several well-deserved Awards.

Kentucky Callin' is a Country Music band with some real good musicians, a remarkable female vocal and a very sensitiv songwriter. They were honored by recieving three Awards in Austria 1995.

The Newcomer band Burning Heart became wellknown in Austria practically over night. Their special musical style is about as young as the band is: New American Music. But they are also excellent at interpreting traditional songs.

Lewis Niderman is a firm compenent of the program at Bad Ischl, already. Especially at Bad Ischl, he maybe should take better care of the American tradition concerning his lyrics.



What friend of good Country music and New American music doesn't know this radio station by now? - More likely, it meanwhile is known by every Austrian and listened to every often.

Even the neighborcountries of Austria verify that. Broadcast - frequencies doesn't stop at borders, as we know.



Bluegrass Special

Doyle Lawson & Quicksilver at St. Pölten. I could hardly believe that, as Doyle Lawson has been among America's Best of Bluegrass for 30 years, now.

He started his career, when he was 18. Then he gathered some experience as a banjo-player at **Jimmy Martin & The Sunny Mountain Boys**.

A few years later he changed band as well as instrument.

His next change lead him to the Country Gentlemen, where he managed to become well-known as a singer and mandoline - player within his eight years of membership.

He considers his entrance to the Gran Ole Opry (the motherchurch of Country music) as one of the Highlights of appreciation for his music.

In 1979 Doyle Lawson founded the **Quicksilver**. Those days were dominated by "Newgrass" and "New Accoustic Music", that dominated very good abilities on the instruments. In spite of all that, Doyle Lawson did a Step into the opposite-direction. He concentraded on polyphone vocals.

Quicksilver already has got a legendary sound with its clear and perfectly interpreded polyphony.

(White) Gospel songs are a special-



ty of Doyle Lawson & Quicksilver.

"Gospel Music is a part of my life for me. I'm catholic, and I feel different from believe inside. The white Gospel Music is only in rhythm a little different from the black Gospel Music. The belief is the same, the inner persuation, too."

Four and five part singing with or without instrumental compamenship is a very important part of Quicksilver's music.

As the years passed by, the formation of Quicksilver changed. But for two years, now, the composition seems to be perfect: Doyle Lawson and the guitarist **Steve Gully** share

the lead and the tenor vocals. **Barry Abernathy** plays the banjo in a quite rhythm - stressed way and sings the bariton. **Dale Perry** doesn't only play the bass, he also has got a remarkable bass - vocals.

The youngest member of Quicksilver is **Owen Saunders** who is a master of the Longbow - technique (violine).

Of course, the most harmonic out of Austria's Bluegrass artists were chosen for the opening. If you happen to be well - informed, you might already know, that there is one band coming up to these expections: **The Nugget.**

The Dutch

The Country Circle Austria has become wellknown in means of high quality Country Music.

It's not really a secret, that Bluegrass Music is a hobby of Oskar Zaglmayr. This time again, the programm offered musical specialities.

The pleasure stars at the composition of the band **Dutch**:

Byron Berlin, who become famous for his virituosity on the fiddle. You can hear him on a good lot of records, with the Rolling Stones or Manhattan Transfer, Emmilou

Harris, John Denver, Rod Steward or Bob Dylan.

But he also can play the mandoline and he has got an excellent voice.

John Hickman is one of the World's five best banjo players. Just like Byron Berlin, he can be heared with several artists.

Henry Nyen comes from the Netherlands, plays the bass and has got a great voice.

John Roelofs is from the Netherlands, too. He managed to convince quite a few American bands by his abilities on the guitar. - You can hear that on several recordings. Furthermore, he has got a to offer a powerful voice.

The band **Nugget** from Vienna was in charge of the opening.

As an encore, the Dutch and the Nugget played some sessions together. This was an event, where you can jump in and 'swimm' in high quality music, a bath for the soul.

Little Nashville in Austria

Does such a thing exist? Yes! It's the "Little Nashville" on the Niederalpl, on a high mointain and with a great panorama, quite similar to Colorado.

After having visited America, the landlady 'Krimi' was convinced, that she wanted to change her Pub in the style of what she saw there.

Herbert, her husband **Tina and Manfred** helped with a lot power
and stamina, and so a Saloon was
created, that is an exact equivalent of
what you can find as a tourist in
Nashville, TN, these days.

Suitcases full of the original decoration were brought from America to Austria by Tina and Manfred, and then, witha lot of love for the detail, all of it was arranged in the "Little Nashville" on the Niederalpl.

The opening of the highest placed Saloon of Austria took place on the 6th and 7th of May, 1995, with live Music by Tina & Country Time Special; Al May & Wolf P. presented their music, the Blue Danube Hillbillies fought a duel, so

that there was lots of action until the early morning.

Since that day, there is Country Music live every Thursday and Friday, and in between there are lots of special events like for example the open air's, every first week of a month is Country week with live Music, and a lot more.

Besides the comfortable furnishing and the posters and pictures of Country Music Stars, there is another very special attraction:

For all those, who like Tequilla, there is the so-called "Tequilla Train", Styria's most high-proof train. It's a copied Western - loc with an open freight car, which offers place for six glasses of Tequilla+Lemon+Salt. That way, this hard storage is trasport directly to the guests at their tables.

For the summer months, there are, in addition to the Saloon, Indian Tipis, that you can rent for one or more nights at a nice prize, no matter, if you want romantic adventure for two, or if you want to spent the night among your friends up to twelve persons.

And those, who prefer it more comfortable have the chance to take a room with either one or two cosy beds, a shower and a restroom, but there are also ordinary rests that invite the warn-out hiker for a little stay.

The staff is exceptional friendly and spents a lot of effort to satisfy the guests. The kitchen should also be mentioned, and I would like to make a positive remark on the menu, that Tina created herself.

The door of the Saloon is made of wood with burnt-in decoration, and behind it, there are the changing cards.

Who is not an insider will probably be a little surprised, when finding dishes like 'Beuschel, Schweinsbraten and Wiener Schnitzel'among the 'Dishes from abroad', though they are typical Austrian dishes.

But after thinking it over, you'll for sure find out, why.- You're in a Saloon, of course. Country Music fans who have skiing can combine their sport with their musical preferance, as there also exists a ski-lift with some nice downhill's. That way, there is a chance to spent ones winter holyday in a quite different way than usual, as the Little Nashville is opened in winter, too.

For all those who are interested in visiting the Little Nashville, I would like to give some information about how to get there.

that distinguishes those three very sympathetic Viennese, their Show also is unique in Austria.


The Salty Dogs gave us remaining impressions, like for example some acrobatic intermezzo on the contrabass.


